

## NEARBY The pont du diable

Get back in your car, and head towards Nans-sous-Sainte-Anne, then follow the signs to "Pont du Diable". After a few kilometres, you'll arrive on this bridge which spans across the "petit Lison", with a staggering 30-metre drop which may make you feel dizzy! Look for the devil sculpture which adorns the bridge. This bridge owes its name to a famous legend... "To build this bridge, which fell every night, the builder sold his soul to the devil, as well as that of the first passer-by. This was the village priest who, carrying his ciborium, drove the devil to the foot of the ravine, never to be seen again..."

### FAVOURITES

#### Montmahoux lookout point

Return to the center of the village of Crouzet-Migette and at the cross roads, head towards Gevesin, then towards Montmahoux. Entering the village, take the first street on the left, then left again and finally take the small path to your right. Once you have reached the top of the path, head to the orientation table.

You will find a breathtaking view of the Jura mountains and the remote of Nans-sous-Sainte-Anne. With a little luck, the sky will be clear and you will be able to see the "Mont Blanc" mountain in the distance the sky.



## VISIT The edge-tool making museum

The edge-tool making museum of Nans-sous-Sainte-Anne is a beautiful example to the work of blacksmiths, who worked metal to serve peasantry. This 19th century farmworkshop specialized in the making of cutting tools and in particular, scythes. Listed as a historic monument, the edge-tool making museum has preserved its trip hammers, water wheels and impressive bellows, all which are put on display for the public.



### The Lison source

is a place of pure tranquility with authentic beauty...

After a winding underground journey, the waters of the Loue river resurface beneath a vast overhang, before flowing into a large pool with a deafening sound! This majestic waterfall, with a blue-green hue, never runs dry. From here, the Lison river travels 25 kilometres before joining the Loue river once again.

#### Sit back and relax!

There is no swimming or bathing allowed and the water is only 8°C.

**The Creux Billard**, an open air canyon which feeds into the Lison source, forms an impressive rocky cirque that is over 100 m high.

The sides of this rock walls dotted with caves, explored by spelunkers.

During flood and snow melt periods, these caves release water triggering a renewal of subterranean streams and aquifers. You'll find an impressive waterfall that is over 100 metres high, descending down to the waters below with a deafening sound. **The rain sometimes has its perks!**

**The Sarrazine cave** is a majestic grotto that is 80 metres high, dug into limestone. At the base, the porch is about 120 metres wide, and around 80 metres deep. **Looking up can be dizzying!**

At the back of the cave, a 2-metre high and 10-metre wide gallery opens up. This gallery leads to a little lake filled with water seeping through the walls. This grotto has over 4km of underground caves that are explored by spelunkers.
